

Do I have a Professional Practice Issue?

Consider each question below to help determine if you have a professional practice issue. This list of questions is not exhaustive but is intended as a guide in your assessment of a situation you may find yourself in as a Regulated Health Professional. To ensure your nursing licence is not at risk it is important to ask the following questions and seek the support of a Steward or Professional Practice leader to address the problem.
